Market Review

During the first quarter, AI related momentum remained a key market driver, driving continued strength in areas like semiconductor capital equipment and driving sector wide selloffs in areas like software and IT services, which the market views as having high risk of disruption. The outbreak of war in Iran pushed oil prices sharply higher, making energy the standout sector of the quarter and reinforcing strength in defense-oriented industries. Major indices delivered mixed results in the first quarter of 2026. The MSCI EAFE Index declined -1.24%, the MSCI Emerging Markets Index fell 0.17%, the S&P 500 Index decreased 4.33%, while the Russell 2000 Index posted a modest gain of 0.89%.

Portfolio Review

The Global Small Cap portfolio underperformed the MSCI All Country World Small Cap Index in the first quarter. Poor stock selection in information technology and poor stock selection and an overweight in financials detracted from performance. An underweight and good stock selection in consumer discretionary and an underweight in real estate contributed positively to performance.

From a geographic perspective, poor stock selection in the United States and poor stock selection and an overweight in Europe ex. U.K. detracted from performance. Good stock selection and an underweight in Asia ex-Japan and an underweight in Africa/Middle East contributed positively to performance.

The biggest contributors to performance during the quarter were Toro Company and Landstar System. Toro's professional business continues to grow due in part due to healthy underground equipment sales. Also, the business's profitability continues to improve. Landstar shares improved as management and investors have become more hopeful that the weak trucking environment is improving in part due to capacity exits following enforcement actions by the DOT. Other top contributors included Caixa Seguridade, Haw Par and AJ Bell.

The biggest detractors from performance during the quarter were Ryan Specialty and nCino. Industry-wide declines in commercial property premiums have caused Ryan Specialty's organic growth pace to moderate. Market fears of disintermediation risk from AI have also pushed insurance broker shares lower. nCino's share price was under pressure, like many other software companies, due to investor concerns about the potential for future disruption caused by AI. Other bottom contributors included Lectra, FincoBank, and ALTEN.

Purchases and Sales

During the quarter, we purchased IntegraFin and Riken Keiki. We sold Grupa Pracuj, Multiply and Pinewood Technology.

IntegraFin provides an investment platform for U.K. financial advisors to manage and invest client assets. The business has had resilient net flows with attractive economic characteristics and high client retention. We purchased shares because we believe that margins have the potential to expand meaningfully in the coming years. Riken Keiki manufactures gas detection and alarm equipment and also provides related maintenance services. The company operates in a highly consolidated global market underpinned by reputational considerations, high customer switching costs, and growing end market demand from diverse sources. Riken is dominant in Japan, has above average exposure to semiconductor fab customers, and is executing well on overseas expansion. Grupa Pracuj is the leading online recruiting platform based in Poland. We decided to exit our position given the increased uncertainty around the long-term implication of the evolution of AI technology. Multiply is collection of leading Italian price comparison websites. We exited our position in Multiply due to increased uncertainty about the future of price comparison websites as consumer-facing AI applications gained popularity. Pinewood Technology provides software solutions to automotive dealerships, with operations across Europe and Asia and plans to expand into the U.S. market. Successful market entry in the U.S. was a key pillar of our investment thesis; however, as our confidence in that outcome diminished, we chose to exit the position.

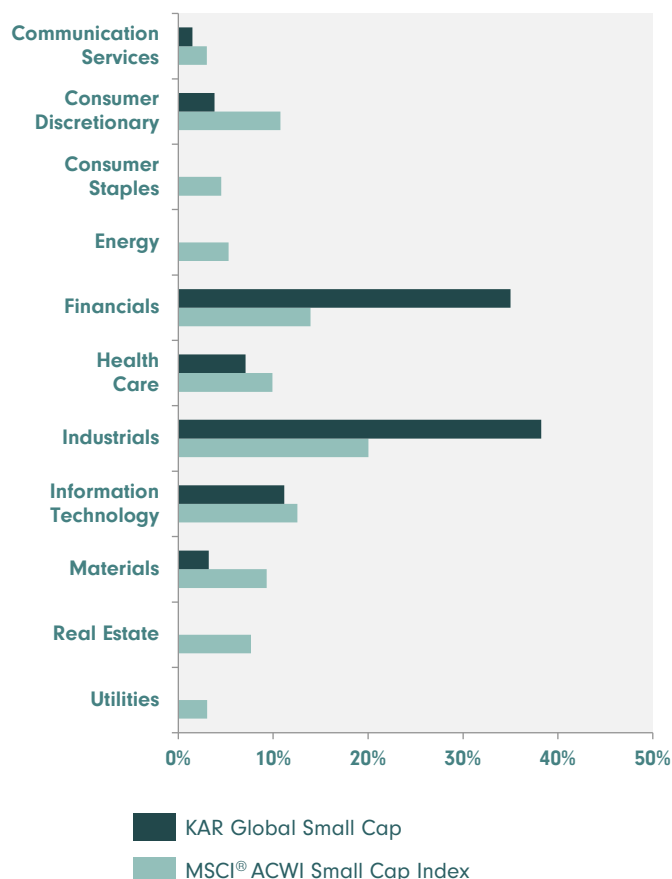

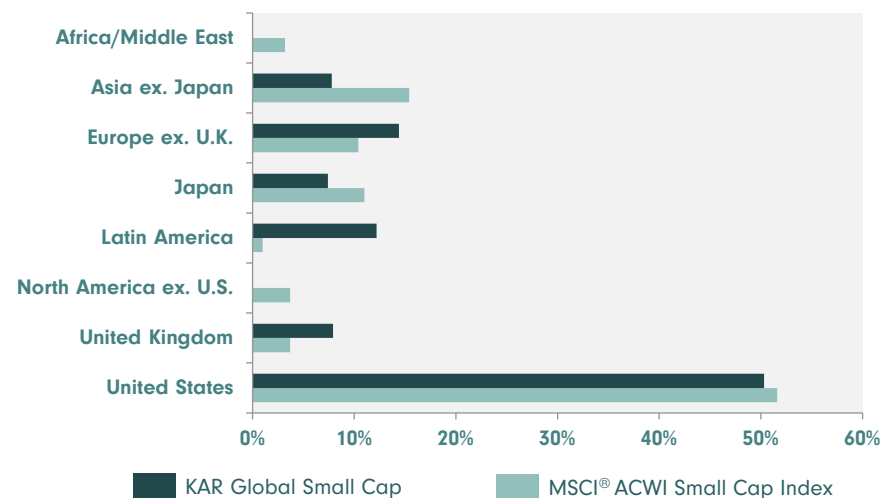

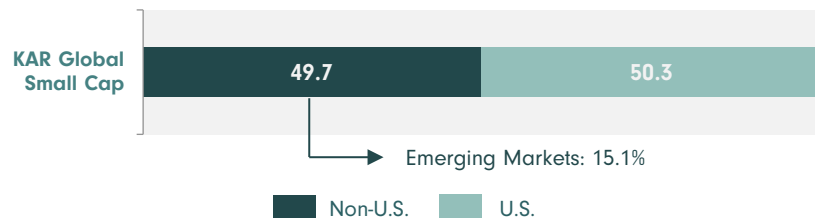
Geographical Exposure

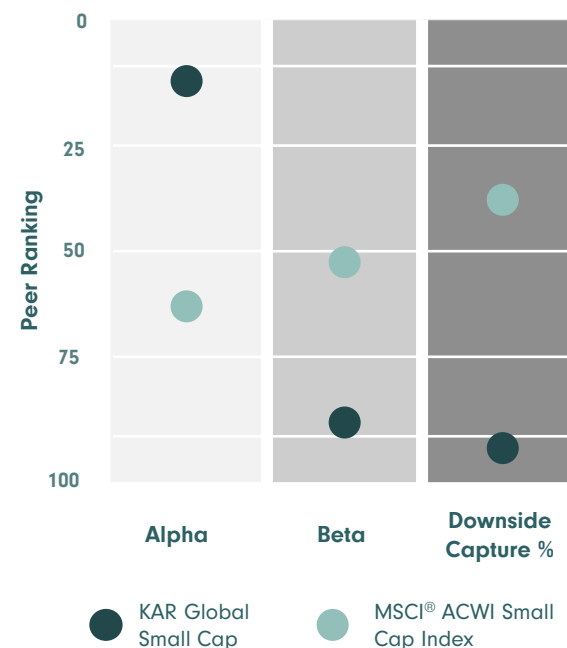

The composite includes all fully discretionary institutional Global Small Cap Portfolios. Global Small Cap Portfolios are invested in equity securities with market capitalizations in line with the MSCI® ACWI Small Cap Index, that have market control, rising free cash flow, shareholder-oriented management, strong consistent profit growth and low-debt balance sheets. For comparison purposes, the composite is measured against the MSCI® ACWI Small Cap Index (net). The MSCI® ACWI Small Cap Index is a market capitalization-weighted index of small-capitalization stocks of the MSCI® Global Investable Market Indices Universe. The index is calculated on a total-return basis with dividends reinvested, net of withholding taxes. Benchmark returns are not covered by the report of the independent verifiers. The inception date of the composite is January 2016. The composite was created in January 2016. Policies for valuing investments, calculating performance, and preparing GIPS Reports are available upon request. GLOSSARY: Alpha: A risk-adjusted measure of an investment's excess return relative to a benchmark. Sharpe Ratio: A risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. Information Ratio: The information ratio (IR) is a measurement of portfolio returns beyond the returns of a benchmark, usually an index, compared to the volatility of those returns. Beta: A quantitative measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole. Downside Capture Ratio: A statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in down-markets. It is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has dropped. Tracking Error: The divergence between the price behavior of a position or a portfolio and the price behavior of a benchmark. It is reported as a standard deviation percentage difference, which reports the difference between the return an investor receives and that of the benchmark they were attempting to imitate.
