The Small Cap Quality Select Composite has been examined for the period from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2019. Kayne Anderson Rudnick Investment Management, LLC ("KAR"), a wholly owned subsidiary of Virtus Investment Partners, Inc., is a registered investment advisor under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Registration of an Investment Advisor does not imply any level of skill or training. KAR manages a variety of equity and fixed-income strategies focusing exclusively on securities the firm defines as high quality.

The composite includes all fully discretionary tax-exempt institutional and pooled Small Cap Quality Select Portfolios. Small Cap Quality Select Portfolios are invested in equity securities with market capitalizations consistent with the Russell 2000® Index, that have market control, rising free cash flow, shareholder-oriented management,

strong consistent profit growth, and low-debt balance sheets. Small Cap Quality Select Portfolios are highly concentrated portfolios, generally consisting of less than 12 securities. For comparison purposes, the composite is measured against the Russell 2000® Index. The Russell 2000® Index is a market capitalization-weighted index of the 2,000 smallest companies in the Russell Universe, which comprises the 3,000 largest U.S. companies. The index is calculated on a total-return basis with dividends reinvested. Benchmark returns are not covered by the report of the independent verifiers. The composite was created in November 2006. A list of composite descriptions and policies for valuing portfolios, calculating performance, and preparing compliant presentations are available upon request.

As of October 1, 2014, the composite was redefined to include only tax-exempt portfolios. Previously, both taxable and tax-exempt portfolios were included. Prior to January 1, 2011, the composite minimum was \$250,000, and accounts that experienced a significant cash flow, defined as aggregate flows that exceeded 25% of the account's beginning of period market value, were temporarily removed from the composite.

Non-fee-paying portfolios represent 16% of the composite assets at year-end 2013, 15% at year-end 2014, 1.2% at year-end 2015, 2.1% at year-end 2016, 2.6% at year-end 2017, 7.2% at year-end 2018, and 8.6% at year-end 2019.

The standard management fee schedule currently in effect is as follows: 1.25% on all assets. Actual management fees charged may vary depending on applicable fee schedules and portfolio size, among other things. Additional information may be found in Part 2A of Form ADV, which is available on request. The performance information is supplied for reference. Past performance is no guarantee of future results. Results will vary among accounts. The U.S. dollar is the currency used to express performance. Returns are presented net of transaction fees and include the reinvestment of all income. Gross returns will be reduced by investment management fees and other expenses that may be incurred in the management of the account. Model net returns have been calculated by deducting 1/12th of the highest tier of the standard management fee schedule in effect for the respective period from the gross composite returns on a monthly basis.

Internal dispersion is calculated using the asset-weighted standard deviation of annual gross returns for accounts in the composite for the entire year. For those years when less than five accounts were included for the full year, no dispersion measure is presented. The three-year annualized ex-post standard deviation measures the variability of the composite (using gross returns) and the benchmark for the 36-month period.
